### **Pamyua**

### Tuesday, October 24 • 9:30 & 12:30

### Recommended for grades 4-12

Pamyua showcases Inuit culture through music and dance performance. The show is a platform to share Indigenous knowledge and history. Their style derives from traditional melodies reinterpreted with contemporary vocalization and instrumentation. Often described as "Inuit Soul Music," Pamyua has discovered their own genre. The group believes unity is possible through music and dance. Together, each member works to interpret Inuit traditions masterfully with joy and sincerity. The response to this message is tremendous as the group is a symbol of pride for Alaska's Indigenous people and to all who see them perform. Pamyua's performances aim to honor and share Indigenous traditions through ceremony, songs, and dance.



### Pete the Cat in Pete's Big Hollywood Adventure Monday, October 30 • 9:30 & 12:30

Recommended for grades PreK-3

Lights! Camera! Action! When Pete the Cat and his buddy Callie sneak into the Hollywood Studios, they get lost in the world of the movies. Join Pete, Callie, Ethel the Apatosaurus, and Robo-Pete in this rockin' new musical adventure that features several fun-filled Pete the Cat books including Cavecat Pete, Pete the Cat and the Treasure Map, and The Cool Cat Boogie.



### The Magic School Bus - Lost in the Solar System Monday, December 4 • 9:30 & 12:30

**Recommended for grades K-5** 

When the class gets lost on the way to the planetarium, Ms. Frizzle saves the day by blasting into outer space for an epic interplanetary field trip! But when rivalries both old and new threaten to tear the students apart, our young heroes must learn to pull together or risk getting forever lost in the solar system. Hop on the Magic School Bus for a ride in this new musical adaptation based on the original book series published by Scholastic.



### **DRUMLine Live** Thursday, February 22 · 9:15 ONLY!

### Recommended for grades 4-12

DRUMLine Live is an international tour based on the Historically Black College and University (HBCU) marching band tradition. With riveting rhythms, bold beats and ear-grabbing energy, this stage show is a synchronized musical showcase of the HBCU experience. Incorporating original compositions and soul-infused interpretations of Top 40 hits, group performances range from colorful, choreographed routines to heavy doses of drum riffs and cadences.



### Malevo

#### Friday, March 1 • 9:30 ONLY! **Recommended for grades 6-12**

The Company has reenvisioned the Argentine dance of Malambo and elevated this traditional dance by fusing its classic technique with other styles such as Flamenco, and incorporating live percussion onstage. Set to a pulsating rhythm of drums, the choreography combines the use of boleadoras, a leather and stone hunting tool used by Gauchos, with fast leg movements, energetic zapateados (stomping), and quick cepillados ("brushing"/"scrubbing"). This exciting and dynamic troupe of men has created a performance that not only pushes the Malambo style beyond its limits but gives audiences an extraordinary visual and sensory experience unlike any other.



### Cat Kid Comic Club: The Musical Friday, March 15 • 9:30 & 12:30

### Recommended for grades 1-5

Cat Kid and Molly Pollywog have started an epic club to teach 21 rambunctious baby frogs how to make their own comics! Their fishy father Flippy is overjoyed that his kids will learn to unleash their creativity, but when the frogs' constant bickering and outrageous imaginations send their comics comically off the rails, Flippy flips out! Will the club survive? Will the frogs ever get along? And will creativity finally save the day? All will be answered in this madcap musical based on Day Pilkey's irreverently hilarious book series. This hilarious musical adaptation of Dav Pilkey's Dog Man spin-off series, Cat Kid Comic Club, is written by Kevin Del Aguila and Brad Alexander.

### Recommended for grades 4-12 Tuesday, April 2 · 12:30 & Wednesday, April 3 · 9:30

BMX, basketball, breakdancing, beatboxing, acrobatics, drumming and more, an international smash hit! A phenomenal physical performance exploring all forms of rotation, 360 ALLSTARS connects the street with the elite to deliver a supercharged urban circus. Boasting a stellar international cast of World Champion and World Record-holding athletes and artists, 360 ALLSTARS is a spectacular fusion of the extraordinary artistry that emerges from street culture.



### The Boy Who Cried Wolf Friday, April 5 · 9:30 & 12:30

### **Recommended for grades PreK-5**

Silas is from a family of shepherds and has to do right by his mum and granddad as he relutantly takes on the responsibility of watching their sheep up on the mountain over twinter. But he's bored, lonely, and missing out on the fun of the annual knitting competition in town, so he cries - "Wolf!" Written by playright Mike Kenny and inspired by Aesop's famous fable, this is a beautiful wintery tale about a boy who learns that "nobody believes a liar, even when they're telling the truth". A gifted cast of actor musicians play instruments and sing live as they embody all the delightful characters, including hilarious sheep and perhaps a scary wolf or two... All set in a village of knitters with fingers flicking, needles clicking and where every new jumper tells a tale! Ultimately, Silas finds a place for himself (and his imagination) in his warm woolly community.



### Charlotte's Web Tuesday, April 9 • 9:30 & 12:30

#### Recommended for grades K-5

Charlotte's Web is based on E.B. White's loving story of the friendship between a pig named Wilbur and a little gray spider named Charlotte. Wilbur has a problem: how to avoid winding up as pork chops! Charlotte, a fine writer and true friend, hits on a plan to fool Farmer Zuckerman. She will create a "miracle." Spinning the words "Some Pig" in her web, Charlotte weaves a solution which not only makes Wilbur a prize pig but also ensures his place on the farm forever. This treasured tale, featuring madcap and endearing farm animals, explores bravery, selfless love and the true meaning of friendship.

Andrés and Christina are the Latin Grammy-winning music duo 123 Andrés. Their catchy songs and lively performances get the whole audience dancing, singing, and learning! Available for family concerts and student matinees, these high-energy, joyful shows celebrate the Latinx experience and incorporate Spanish, English, and ASL. Their educational shows are adapted for PreK audiences up to 6th grade and introduce a variety of musical instruments and styles from Central and South America, along with geography, social studies, and the Spanish language. The company has also created multiple bilingual books, published by Scholastic, based on their songs including Hello, Friend (Hola, Amigo) and Ten Little Birds (Diez Pajaritos). These books are perfect to connect the performances to reading and writing for the younger elementary ages.

Everyone knows that Mrs. Granger, the language arts teacher, has X-ray vision in her classroom. She's also a fanatic about the dictionary, which is hopelessly boring to one of her students Nicholas Allen. But when Nick learns an interesting tidbit about words and where they come from, it inspires him to invent a new word. From now on, a pen is no longer a pen—it's a FRINDLE. By the story's end, we find that Mrs. Granger not only taught Nick about the importance of words and their origins, but also about having the courage to stand up for himself when he faced opposition. FRINDLE is an imaginative, quirky tale about creative thought and the power of words.

Increasing an awareness of trauma can help us change the story, turning less than ideal circumstances into opportunities to create something new.
